International Mountain Day was observed for the first time in the country on December 11 in a befitting manner. The Ministry of Chittagong Hill Tracts Affairs (MoCHTA) organised the day's program in partnership with FAO, ILO, UNDP, ICIMOD, CHT Associatio-Dhaka and Bangladesh Adventure Club while the Daily Star and Channel i were the media partners.

The Day's program began with a colorful rally. The rally started at 9 am from the proposed site of CHT Complex at Bailey road and ended at CIRDAP premise.

After the rally a seminar on "Mountains: Key to a Sustainable Development" was held at 11 am at the International Conference Centre of CIRDAP.
